








## Community Affairs Monthly Summary

On August 12<sup>th</sup>, the Community Affairs office was requested to prepare a presentation to youth in grades ranging from 5<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup>. The content requested regarded internet safety and how to conduct oneself online. Community affairs officers developed a presentation and Officer Matt Miller presented this information to the class at the Sylvania Township Police station.

On August 18<sup>th</sup>, Sylvania School District officially began welcoming students back to school. The official start dates for each grade differed as students were slowly integrated into full enrollment. The community affairs officers who are assigned to the elementary and middle schools spent time at each of their respective schools to familiarize themselves with new students. This also doubled as an opportunity for those same students to learn the names and faces of their assigned school officers.



On August 19<sup>th</sup>, Officers Matt Miller and Joe Sulaica filled a request to supply "Active Threat" training to the staff at the Lakes of Sylvania (pictured left and right). The officers created this presentation based on their own training and experience. It is available to any Sylvania Township company or group wishing to inform employees or participants of the best practices of safety in an active threat situation. This training was so well attended that Officer Miller came back on August 22<sup>nd</sup> to complete another training session for the remaining staff that could not attend the first session. Key topics included, "be an active participant in your own survival" and "the body can't go where the mind hasn't already been."



**Social Media:** In addition to monitoring the STPD Facebook page daily and responding to messages, three posts were made:

- August 29: Shared a post from the Ohio State Fire Marshal asking for the public's help in identifying any suspects in a recent arson investigation

**Public Safety Cadets:** Two meetings were held in August, consisting of firearms and range safety, and live fire range day. The sessions included classroom-based lectures and hands-on live fire at the STPD outdoor range. No ride-alongs were completed this month. There are eight active cadets listed on the roster, with one more prospective new member.
