








## Community Affairs Summary

On January 6th and 31st, STPD Administration and Community Affairs Officers assisted Sylvania Area Family Services with restocking their food pantry from the Lucas County Food Bank, along with members of the Sylvania Township Road Department.

On January 28th, 29th, and 30th, Lt. Steinman, Officer Miller, and Officer Sulaica delivered a civilian-based Active Threat/Aggressor Response training to staff members at Devine Rehabilitation Center (5757 Whiteford Rd.). This training helps teach community members the mindset and skills required to survive an active threat situation.



Throughout this month, Officer Sulaica began teaching LEAD classes to Fifth Graders at Hillview Elementary and Whiteford Elementary. This instruction will continue through the month of March.

Officer Miller began working on information and registration paperwork for this year's Safety Township, which will be held in the first week of June at Central Trail Elementary. The paperwork will be distributed during the upcoming "Kindergarten Information Nights" at the various elementary schools in the Township.

On January 27th, Liz Young from the Sylvania Prevention Alliance came to the station and recorded a video demonstration with Officers Miller and Sulaica regarding how to utilize the Medication Disposal Box in our lobby. This video will be part of a presentation about safe medication disposal that those officers will deliver to seniors at the Sylvania Senior Center on February 12th.
