








## Community Affairs Monthly Summary



The month of June (2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>) started off with a big project- Safety Town. Our community affairs officers prepare diligently for this annual event (pictured with Officer Sulaica on the right and volunteers pictured on the left). This weeklong educational opportunity is for preschool age children who are preparing for kindergarten. During this week, children learn basic safety tools they can use, not only this upcoming summer, but also as they transition to elementary school. Topics include bicycle safety, road safety, and crosswalk safety. Visitors from the community such as the Metroparks, Sylvania bus garage, Lucas County Canine Care and Control, Republic Services (waste removal), Sylvania Township Road department, Sylvania Fire Department, and more pay a visit to the students. This is a terrific and rewarding undertaking that the Sylvania Township Police Department is proud to offer to our community.



On June 7<sup>th</sup> community affairs officers participated in what was called the 2025 Jeep Fest "Hype Bash." This occurred at Yark Auto on Central Ave. The purpose of the event was to get people excited about the Jeep Fest event occurring later this summer in Toledo. The theme of the event was public safety and our officers took the opportunity to network, recruit and reach out to the community.

On June 10<sup>th</sup> Officers Matt Miller and Joe Sulaica, assisted by Lt. Kevin Steinman, provided education to employees of the Camp Miakonda boy scout reservation on active shooter/active aggressor protocol. This a service our officers are happy to provide to any organization who wishes to educate their employees. Lt. Steinman also assisted with a "stop the bleed" training. This training teaches students how to properly use a tourniquet and other life saving measures when encountering major bleeding injuries.

On June 12<sup>th</sup>, community affairs officers were invited to Lionheart Children's Academy at Five Lakes Church to speak to the children under their care. The purpose of this visit was, largely, to familiarize the young children with police officers and the work police officers do. Many young children have not previously interacted with the police, and it is important for children to have a positive interaction with the police early in life.

## DEA Officer 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Report

During the 2nd quarter of 2025, I participated in several search warrants and operations resulting in the seizure of the below listed drugs of abuse as well as valuable assets. I continue to investigate leads in the DEA cases that I have that are currently open. Presentation to the Lucas County Grand Jury is pending on the US Mail carrier who was previously arrested. Laboratory results have been received. I previously investigated three individuals in Sylvania Township for drug trafficking offenses who were occupants of the same residence that a young girl lived at who inadvertently took a backpack to school which was found to contain marijuana and counterfeit pills containing methamphetamine and fentanyl. I have indicted the individuals, and they have been arrested. One of the individuals has plead guilty and has been sentenced to 9 years in state prison as a result of being convicted of this case as well as two other cases. A resolution is pending with the other two defendants.

I have federally indicted the individual that was mentioned in last quarters report for providing fentanyl to a Sylvania Township resident who died due to ingesting the drug. The defendant faces a federal mandatory minimum sentence of 20 years, up to life if convicted. The case is in the preliminary stages of the judicial phase.

I, along with my DEA partners, have been assigned to assist in the investigation of an overdose death in which a target of a DEA investigation was found to have provided fentanyl to an individual who gave it to a pregnant woman who died as a result of ingesting it. The target of the DEA investigation was arrested for unrelated drug trafficking offenses and is in federal custody facing a potential minimum 10-year sentence. Indictment for the death is pending, which as mentioned above, carries a 20-year mandatory minimum up to life sentence. At the time of this individual's arrest, he was residing in Sylvania Township.

I was involved in the surveillance of a known drug trafficker which led to a residential search warrant being executed where 23 kilograms of cocaine were seized along with \$39,000 in US currency.
