






## Community Affairs Monthly Summary

On March 24, Officer Miller and Officer Sulaica attended the Art Show held at the Sylvania Senior Center (pictured at right), celebrating the 23<sup>rd</sup> year of the Senior Center at their current building. Officers interacted with the show's 85 other attendees, as well as the various artists.

Officer Miller and Officer Sulaica began planning for this year's compliance checks of liquor establishments relating to underage alcohol sales, as well as other enforcement efforts for underage alcohol offenses. Every year, the department receives grant money from the Sylvania Prevention Alliance to engage in these enforcement efforts. This is simply one component of a broader, comprehensive strategy for preventing alcohol-related tragedies in our community. Officers also coordinate with agents from the Ohio Investigative Unit (Liquor Control) for these checks and other operations.



On March 17, Officer Sulaica participated in "Cops & Conversation" through the Lucas County Board of Developmental Disabilities. At the event, he and other law enforcement officers from area departments got the opportunity to engage with people with developmental disabilities and answer questions about policing.



During March, Officer Sulaica concluded teaching LEAD classes to Fifth Graders at Hillview Elementary and Whiteford Elementary. A short "graduation" ceremony for each class was held to acknowledge their hard work throughout the 10 weeks of lessons.

## DEA Officer 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Report

In the 1st quarter of 2025, I participated in several search warrants and operations resulting in the seizure of the below listed drugs of abuse as well as valuable assets. I continue to investigate leads in the DEA cases that I have that are currently open. The individual that was mentioned in the previous quarterly report that was suspected to have child sexual abuse material on his cellular phone has been indicted and arrested. An additional investigation is being conducted by the FBI. I assisted the United States Postal Service Office of the Inspector General regarding a postal carrier that was suspected of trafficking and using controlled substances while at work and using his assigned postal delivery vehicle. An arrest of the carrier was made, and evidence of drug abuse and trafficking was seized and documented. I will present this case to the Lucas County Court of Common Pleas once laboratory analysis is completed.

I previously investigated three individuals in Sylvania Township for drug trafficking offenses who were occupants of the same residence that a young girl lived at who inadvertently took a backpack to school which was found to contain marijuana and counterfeit pills containing methamphetamine and fentanyl. I have indicted the individuals, and they have been arrested.

The overdose death case which I am investigating is also close to indictment. The suspect has been arrested by the Adult Parole Authority for a violation of the terms of his probation. The Assistant United States Attorney has moved the indictment to potentially late April or early May.
