




Community Affairs Monthly Summary



Overview: On May 2, 2025 and in partnership with the Sylvania Township Road Department, Community affairs officers Joe Sulaica and Matt Miller with Sergeant Kurtis Myers helped unload a delivery of food from the SeaGate Food Bank. Roughly every four weeks, the Seagate Food Bank provides a shipment of food to the Sylvania Area Family Services (SAFS) for distribution to the underserved of our community. Each delivery is picked up/unloaded by one of three groups: STPD/Road Dept; SCPD/Sylvania Streets Dept.; and STFD/Sylvania Rec.



On May 15, 2025, Community Affairs Officers Joe Sulaica and Matt Miller were asked to present information on “Scam Prevention” to the clients of Balhoff Wealth Advisors Inc. The leaders of Balhoff Wealth Advisors Inc. realize that a large number of their clients are advanced in age and, as a result, are a target demographic for scams.
