








Community Affairs Monthly Summary

On October 8th, community affairs officers Matt Miller and Joe Sulaica participated in the Walk of Light at Sylvania Southview High School, hosted by Sylvania Prevention Alliance (SPA). The event encourages the youth of the community to “celebrate Sylvania making Healthy Choices.” This is the first Walk of Light since the Covid19 pandemic, and SPA has hopes to bring it back to its former glory.

Officers Matt Miller and Taylor Perry were invited to participate in the Lourdes University career fair on October 22. The officers were able to interact with students who have a special interest in police work. Career fairs are a wonderful opportunity for interested students to ask questions and gain insight into the work of Sylvania Township Police Officers.

Our community affairs officers completed a request for active threat training to employees of the surgery center at Promedica Wildwood in late October. This service offers strategies and tactics to employ in necessary situations. The employees are taught to be a participant in their own survival. Alongside the PowerPoint presentation given, participants also got the opportunity to practice what they learned in two scenarios based on potential real-world situations.

On October 25th, in partnership with Sylvania City Police and SPA, we conducted this year’s second “Drug Take-Back Day.” This event seeks to make our community safer by eliminating the dangers of misused prescription drugs. Our team set up a drive-through drop off for unwanted prescription drugs at Kroger, and we are proud to announce that a total of 132.4 pounds of prescription drugs were collected for destruction. The drugs collected were weighed, recorded and handed off to the Drug Enforcement Administration for destruction. We thank the community for great participation!

- October 29 – Post seeking the public’s help in identifying a suspect in a shooting.



Public Safety Cadets: Two meetings were held in October, consisting of Supreme Court case presentations and interviews for cadet class leadership positions. Also covered was a team building exercise with a “murder mystery.” These meetings also discussed the upcoming transition of mentorship- township Sgt. Ben Bostater will be succeeded by Officer Joe Sulaica. No ride-alongs were completed this month. There are eight active cadets listed on the roster, with two more prospective new members.
